About the hosting organization

FITT is a public utility umbrella organization for youth NGOs and student unions (from 14 different specialties). With 30 member organizations (2000 active young members) and 26 years of activity in the West Region, FITT is the most important, old and unique in respect of activity, legal provisions and its leaders profile, in this part of the country. It's focus on youth participation, local and national youth policies and on promoting the European values at local, regional and national level that are so important to youth nowadays.





About the project

"Creating a framework and developing contents for tomorrow's youth centers" consists of equipping youth centers and youth organizations with a series of competences and skills for young people and youth workers and working methods and tools for the same categories adapted to the needs of the future.

More precisely, the project aims at creating a framework for tomorrow's youth centers, based on an innovative approach.

- 1. Developing and testing a set of tools for youth work (based on the criteria of the European Council Quality Label) in the four youth centers of the consortium over the period of two years and a half.
- 2. Creating and testing needs-adapted contents focused on career planning and youth inclusion in the four youth centers of the consortium, over the period of two years and a half.
- 3. Developing a platform for the use of young people in Timisoara and interested in Timisoara (covering events, trainings, youth exchanges, etc.), over the period of two years and a half.





Objectives of the Youth Exchange

- How to prepare a job application?
 - How to develop a career plan?
- How to interpret fluctuations on the changing labour market?
- The main idea of this Youth Exchange is to provide the participants with skills and knowledge in searching for job opportunities.



All the participants will have to deliver sessions during the youth exchange.

About the Youth Exchange

Working methods:

Generally, the methods that will be used are rather non-formal, non-frontal and participative. The program is built by using a combination of different methods such as: ice-breakers, energizers, experimental learning, groupwork, team-building exercises, role-plays, brainstorming, case studies, presentations, games, introspection, debate. There will be used methods, which enable interactivity between participants, so that a proper environment for dialogue is created.

Working language:

The working language of the Youth Exchange is English. Don't be afraid if your English is not perfect! Neither is ours. But it should be good enough to participate actively. Also be prepared to communicate in other ways with the locals because you are coming in a rural area where most of them don't know English!



Venue, Community and Food

The participants of the Youth Exchange will be hosted in Ceraşu, a small village in Prahova County, in - Pensiunea Ceraşu. The guesthouse has several bedrooms that you will be sharing with other participants of the same gender but mixed nationalities. The bathrooms are in the rooms or shared with other rooms. Bedsheets and towels are available for each participant.

The guesthouse has space for indoor and outdoor activities. The area is pretty remote, but you can find a small shop nearby.

Unfortunately, the venue of the Youth Exchange is not suitable for people with mobility issues.

The food will be prepared in the guest house's kitchen. There are 3 meals per day – breakfast, lunch and dinner. Depending on the program of the day, some of the meals will also be outside of the guest house.

If you have any special DIETS or ALLERGIES, mention it in the application form and to your coordinator.
